
Bachowski motioned to approve Resolution 2021-2 and 2021-3 budget adjustments for 2021. 2nd by Grover. Carried.

Minutes of the Utility Committee meeting held at 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 2, 2021 at city hall, 220 Stout Street, Chetek, WI

Members Present: Earl Grover, Terry Hight, Dan Knapp
Also present: Carmen Newman

Dan Knapp presented some estimates for replacement of the refuse trucks. The residential truck was purchased used in October 2017 for \$44,700. At that time the city also purchased the residential cans that are picked up with the arm on the truck. The cost of the truck was minimal and the intent was to try this process while not having to put a lot of money into the truck. The process has been working well and the truck will need to be replaced soon as we are experiencing more repairs.

The commercial truck was purchased in 2013 and has served its useful life. The estimated cost to replace the commercial truck is between \$250,000 to \$280,000. The residential truck is estimated at around \$300,000. Dan will get some updated proposals.

The city will need to borrow funds to replace both trucks. Dan advised we could wait on the commercial truck but the cost will only get higher and we are having frequent breakdowns and we do not have a backup truck for picking up dumpsters. It is getting more difficult to rent a truck and the cost is high.

Carmen advised we would need approximately \$70,000 to purchase the commercial truck in addition to the trade in value of approximately \$60,000 and \$147,000 of outlay funds. The purchase of the residential truck would be through a loan.

Dan feels if both trucks are replaced this year then the replacement of the trucks would be staggered in the future - the commercial in approximately six (6) years and residential in approximately ten (10) years. This would allow us to continue to make payments on the loan and also put money into the outlay account.

Dan will get updated prices on the trucks and Carmen will get some numbers put together for a loan - looking at possibly combining the truck loan with the outstanding debt on the pension loan currently with Sterling Bank.

Adopting Post-Issuance Debt Compliance Policy for Tax-exempt and Tax-advantaged Governmental Bonds

WHEREAS, the City of Chetek, Wisconsin (the "City") from time to time will issue tax-exempt and tax-advantaged governmental bonds; and

WHEREAS, the City Council (the "Council") of the City has reviewed the Post-Issuance Debt Compliance Policy in connection with the Post-Issuance Debt Compliance Procedures and has determined that it is in the best interest of the District to adopt the Policy.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF CHETEK, WISCONSIN; the Council approves the Policy as shown in the form attached; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; City staff are authorized to take all actions necessary to carry out the Post-Issuance Debt Compliance Policy and Post-Issuance Debt Compliance Procedures.

Our records indicate that there is **currently no policy and procedures** on file relating to post issuance compliance. **If you have a current policy in place, please send us a copy for our files.** Significant changes have taken place which has led us to revise our policy and procedure document templates.

Due to increased underwriter scrutiny (the Municipalities Continuing Disclosure Cooperation initiative "MCDC" in March of 2014 and afterward) regarding disclosure practices we are now including several procedural items in our policy templates that are intended to assist the obligated person with how to monitor compliance with each unique Continuing Disclosure Agreement.

Effective February 27, 2019, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) required amendments to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act (the "Rule") to include two additional reportable events, increasing the number of required event notices to 16. The two additional reportable events are as follows:

- *Incurrence of a financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, if material, or agreement to covenants, events of default, remedies, priority rights, or other similar terms of a financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, any of which affect security holders, if material; and,*
- *Default, event of acceleration, termination event, modification of terms, or other similar events under the terms of the financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, any of which reflect financial difficulties.*

Numerous Industry experts have suggested updating policies and procedure documents to ensure Issuers are ready to comply with the complexity of the new rules.

Now is a good time to adopt the procedure documents to provide underwriters and current security holders assurance that your entity is prepared to comply with your post issuance obligations.

In addition, IRS Form 8038-G which is the information return that must be filed upon each issuance of tax-exempt obligations asks issuers to check a box if they have written procedures to monitor compliance with the arbitrage and private activity rules. Although there is no statutory requirement that you have written procedures, disclosing the absence of such procedures may prompt an IRS examination.
